PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE DEMONSTRATION

The secretary will be permitted to take the contest agenda into the presentation room; this is to be submitted with the minutes to the judges.

The parliamentary authority, *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* (11th Edition), or any other reference materials, may be used in the preparation room but not during the parliamentary demonstration.
