

Rekey the following chart note using SOAP formatting and correcting spelling, grammar, and punctuation. Use yesterday's date as date of exam and date dictated, and today's date as date transcribed.

Patient, Kathleen Dahl, born August 5, 1955, was seen by her primary care physician, Kristina Johnson.

This 61 year old female patient presence with complaints of urinary burning and frequency. She has experienced this for four days. She also states she has nocteria and gets up five times every night to void. There have been no hematuria.

BP is 146/95, tempature 99.7, and pulse 80. Skin is warm and dry. She appears pale. Upon inspection, cervix is clean with no material seen in the vault. Adnexal areas are normal. No masses or tenderness noted.

Diagnosis is cystitis.

Ordered Cipro 250 mg q12 hour for three days, Pyridium 200 mg q4-6h p.r.n. burning, push oral fluids, return to office in four days if symptoms have not resolved.
